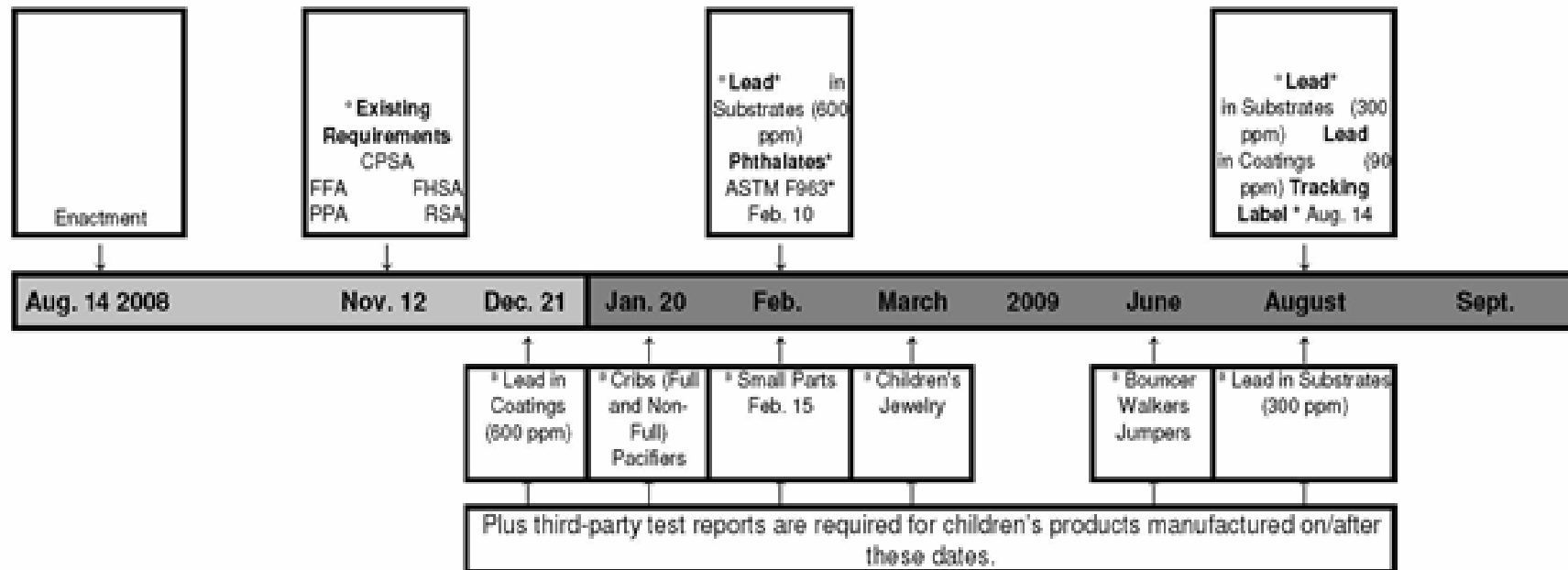

CPSIA Key Reporting Dates

Importers and domestic manufacturers must certify compliance to these requirements for products manufactured on/after the dates listed below.



* Manufacturer's Certificate (GCC) – All Products

CPSIA Requirements

Section 101 – Children’s Products Containing Lead

Section 101 sets new limits for the lead content in children’s products and the amount of lead in the paint used on those products.

Beginning from August 14, 2009, the maximum allowable total lead content of “Paint and similar surface coating and certain consumer products” has been reduced to 0.009% (equivalent to 90 PPM).



CPSIA Requirements

Section 103 – Tracking Labels for Children's Products

Section 103(a) of the new law requires manufacturers to have a tracking label on any consumer product primarily intended for children twelve and younger. The tracking label must contain certain basic information.

This new regulation applies to products made on or after August 14, 2009.



CPSIA Requirements

Section 108 – Products Containing Certain Phthalates

Section 108 of the CPSIA generally is to ensure that children are not exposed to certain specified phthalates while playing, sleeping, or eating.



CPSIA Requirements

Section 108 – Products Containing Certain Phthalates

Children's toys and child care articles

- Must not contain DEHP, DBP, or BBP exceeding 0.1%

Toys that can be placed in a child's mouth, and child care articles

- Must not contain DINP, DIDP, or DnOP exceeding 0.1%
- Placed in the mouth – less than 5 centimeters
